- £65m over 5 yrs - approx £20m for Africa



What we do and who we work with

- We support decision-makers (typically governments) in delivering '*climate compatible development*'.
- We do this by combining **research, advisory services and knowledge management**, to support locally owned and managed policy processes.



- We provide support **across the policy cycle** from developing the evidence base and defining the policy, to accessing finance, building capacity and implementing plans
- We do not preselect countries – instead we are **demand-led** and operate in response to requests for assistance. Filters: high vulnerability, strong leadership and governance, catalytic opportunities
- We can work at regional, national and local level.

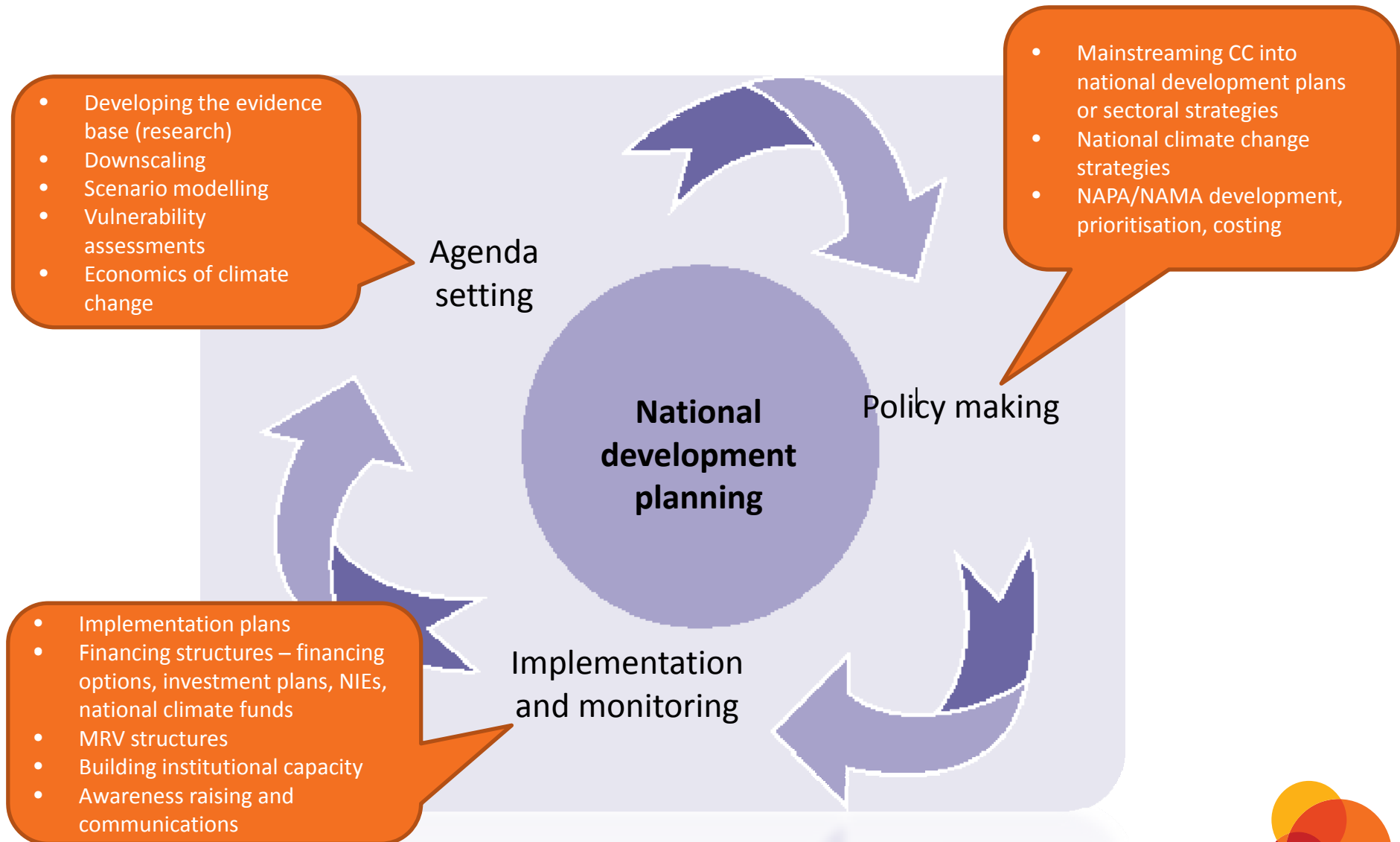

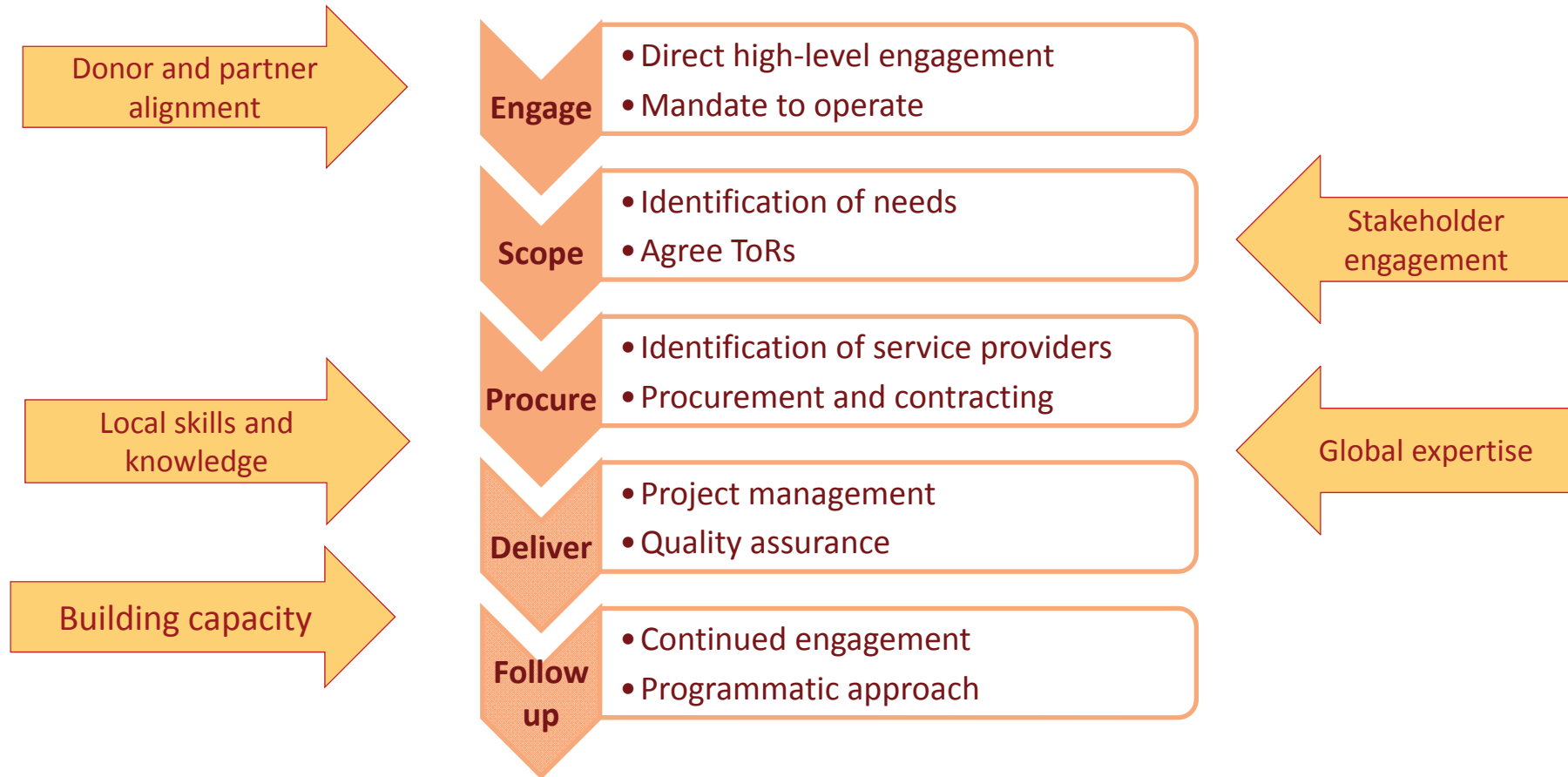

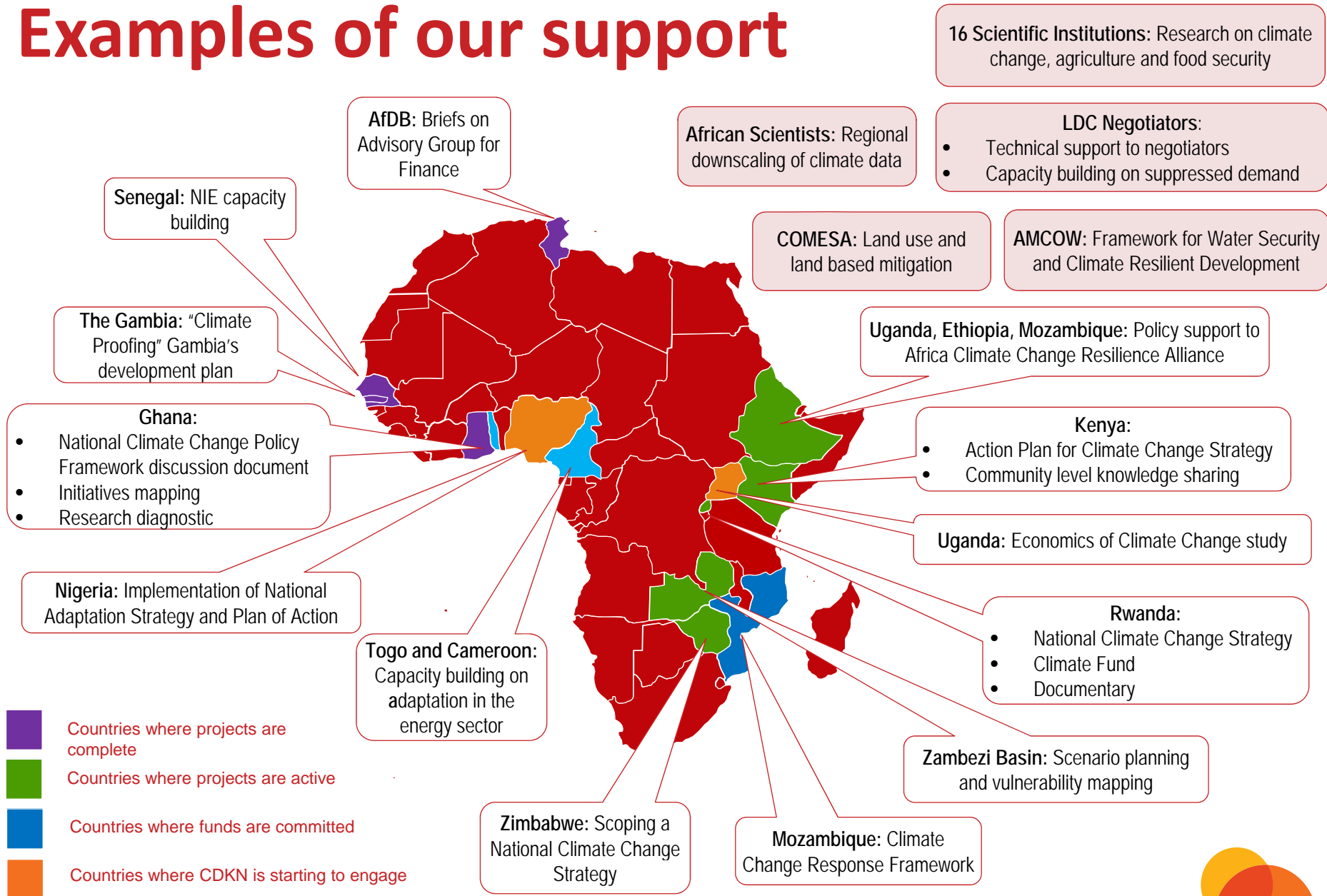
