

# Tracking Climate Change Finance:

Policy Markers in OECD's Creditor Reporting System and their possible adaptation to domestic budgets in non-OECD countries



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Climate markers are statistical codes employed by OECD-DAC to measure the aid targeting at climate change mitigation and adaptation.

## Climate Change Mitigation Marker

The activity contributes to

- a) the mitigation of climate change by limiting anthropogenic emissions of GHGs, including gases regulated by the Montreal Protocol; **or**
- b) the protection and/or enhancement of GHG sinks and reservoirs; or
- c) the integration of climate change concerns with the recipient countries' development objectives through institution building, capacity development, strengthening the regulatory and policy framework, or research; **or**
- d) developing countries' efforts to meet their obligations under the Convention.

## Climate Change Adaptation Marker

- a) the climate change adaptation objective is explicitly indicated in the activity documentation; **and**
- b) the activity contains specific measures targeting the definition below.

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Definition of adaptation: It intends to reduce the vulnerability of human or natural systems to the impacts of climate change and climate-related risks, by maintaining or increasing adaptive capacity and resilience. This encompasses a range of activities from information and knowledge generation, to capacity development, planning and the implementation of climate change adaptation actions.

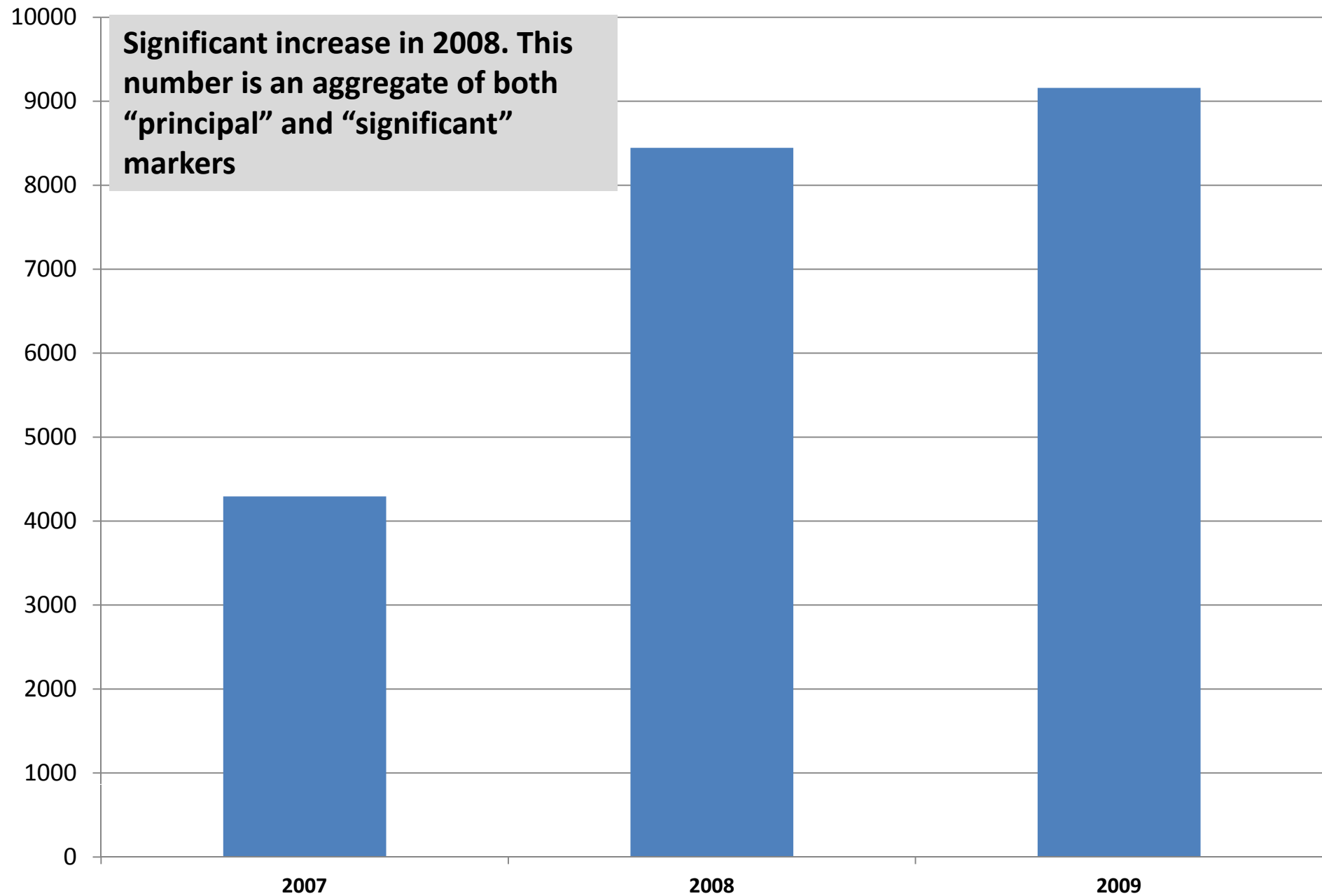

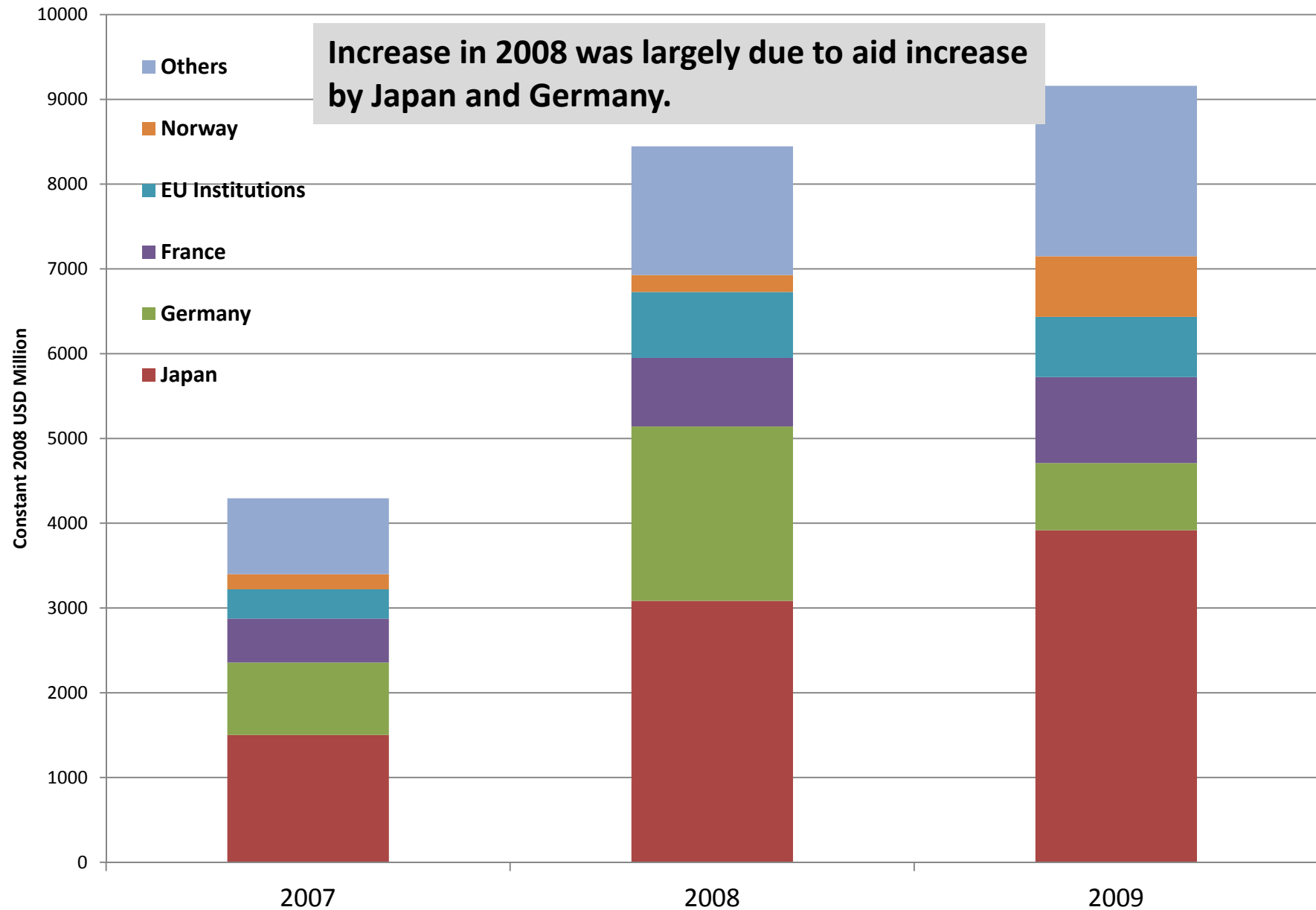

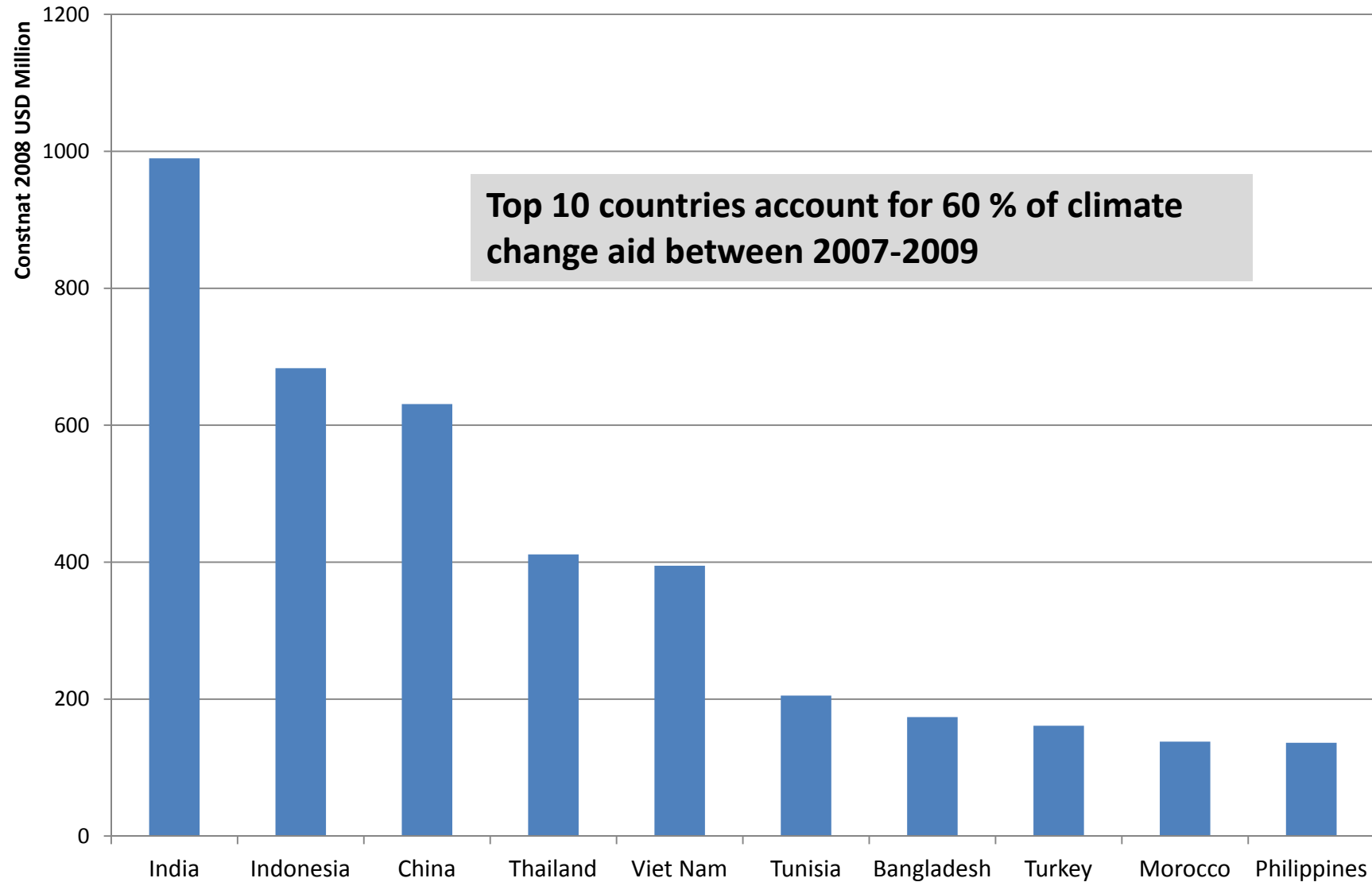


# Aid for Climate Change Mitigation: Who is giving?



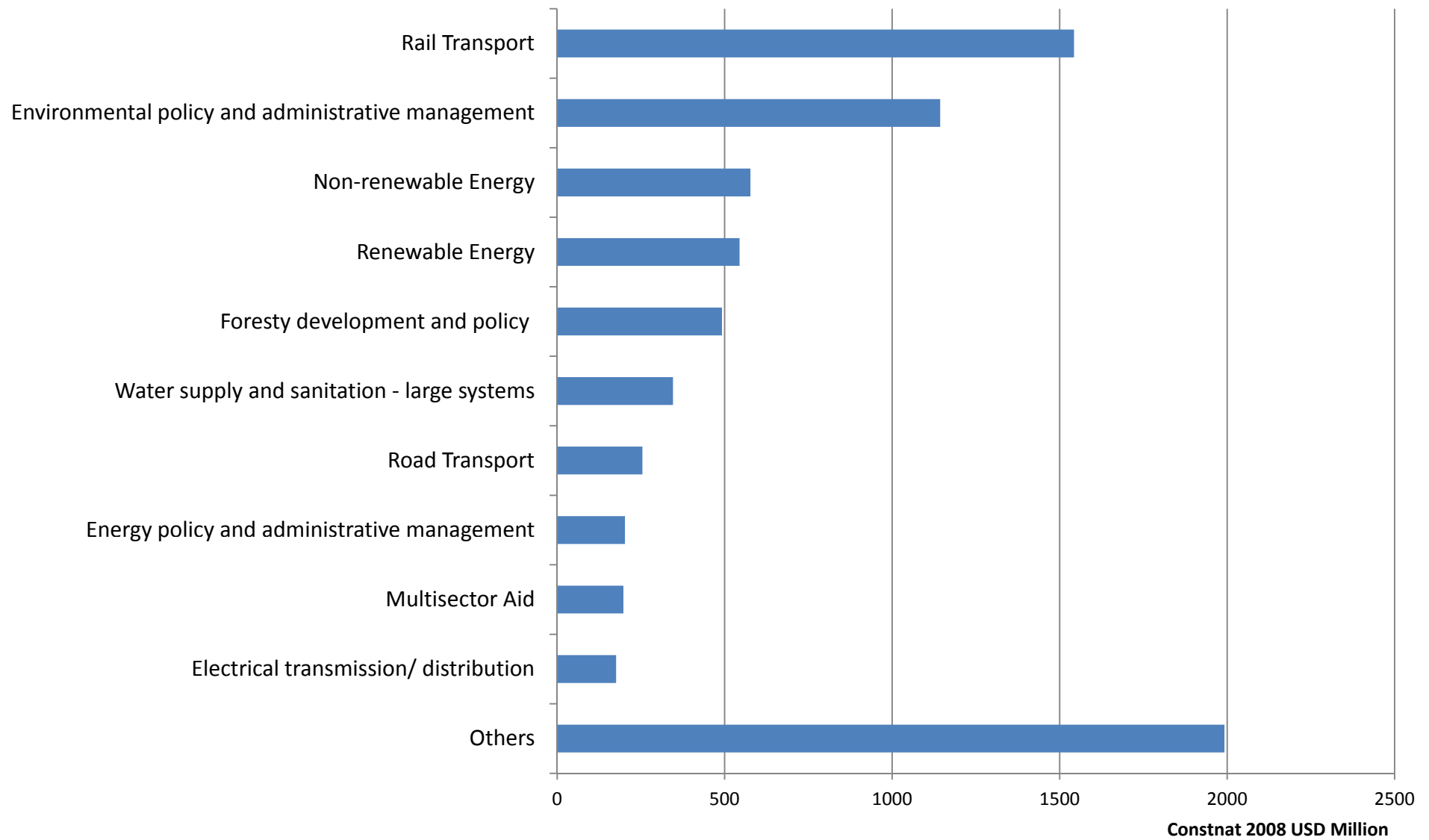
Note that approximately half of Japanese Aid for Climate Change is provided through loans, not grants.
